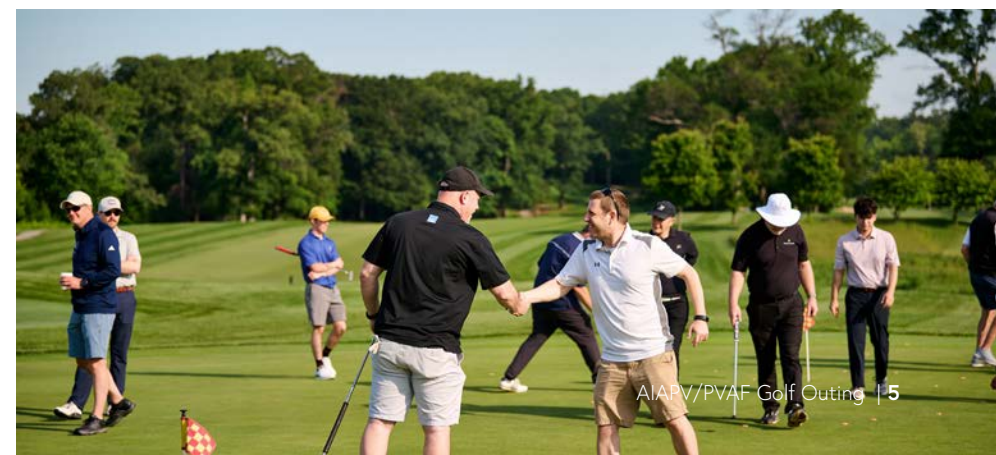
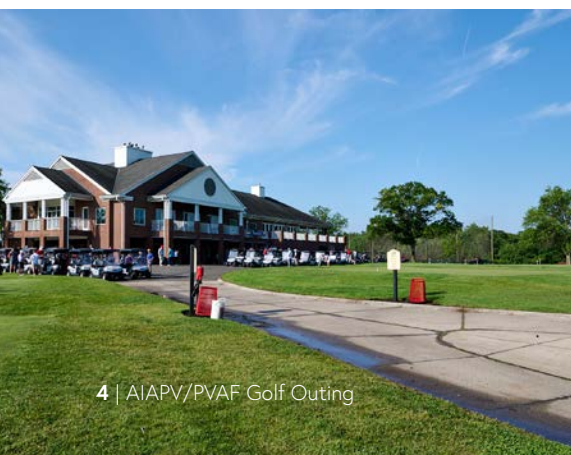
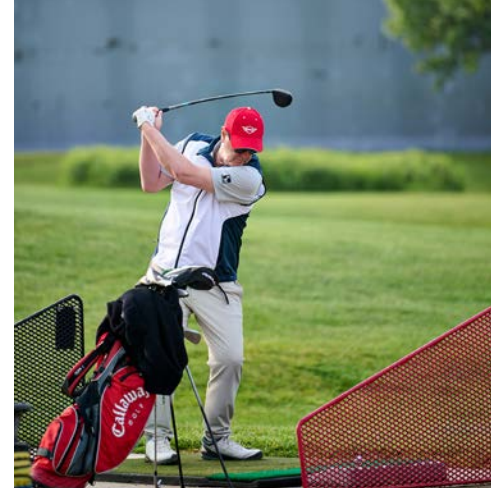
The Potomac Valley Architecture Foundation (PVAF) is a 501(c)(3) organization and is the charitable arm of AIA Potomac Valley (AIAPV). PVAF's mission is educational outreach related to architecture; two of our priority initiatives support and develop young talent in the industry:

- PVAF financially supports AIAPV's Emerging Professional Awards Program, which provides a one-year leadership and professional development program and mentorship with AIAPV's Fellows.
- PVAF also provides scholarships to deserving students enrolled in architecture programs at the University of Maryland and Montgomery College.

In addition, PVAF offers programs engaging professionals, students, contractors, manufacturers, community leaders and the general public in discussions related to architecture, with an emphasis on sustainability and resiliency. We own and operate LEAFHouse, the University of Maryland's 2007 Solar Decathlon award-winning entry. This 800-square-foot solar-powered gem is located on the College Park campus and has served as a vibrant community learning and resource center, and even sometimes as a performance venue. Over the years, our members have used LEAFHouse as an interface with professional, academic, community, and business groups to foster conversations about how good design can improve and enrich our world.

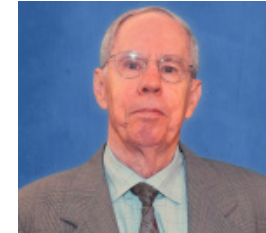

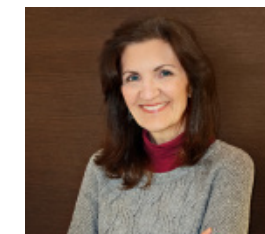

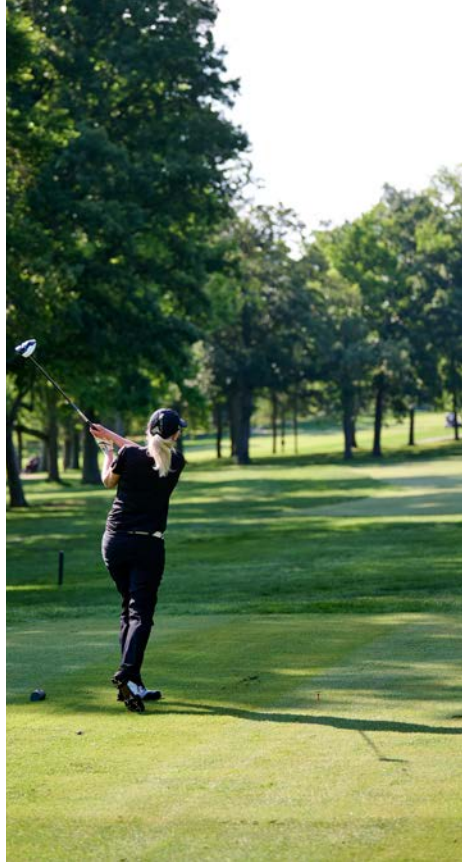

AIA Potomac Valley's Emerging Professional Awards Program (EPAP) winners engage in a yearlong career development program under the guidance of their mentor, who is a member of AIAPV's Group of Fellows. They also have access to the entire Group of Fellows as additional mentors, which provides priceless advice and knowledge. EPAP activities are a mixture of group and individual sessions and include participation in AIA leadership programs, AIA Baltimore's CivicLab, curated tours, discussions of timely professional topics, and networking events.

AIA Potomac Valley's Emerging Professional Awards Program (EPAP) honors and develops our Emerging Professionals, draws on the talents of our Fellows, and stimulates the entire AIAPV community. EPAP is an annual event for the AIAPV community.

EPAP is designed to recognize outstanding Emerging Professional leaders and provide them with a yearlong opportunity to hone their leadership skills. Each year, EPAP winners will be honored as part of AIAPV's

Excellence in Design Awards ceremony. They will receive a \$500 cash award and will then embark on one year of career leadership development through a curated, yearlong mentorship program with AIAPV's Fellows. They will also receive a stipend of up to \$1,000 to be allocated towards leadership-related programs, career development, and networking opportunities. Among other things, the stipend might be used to support payment of AIA and AIAPV dues; attending the AIA annual conference, AIA Leadership Summit, and other AIA events; and participating in the annual AIAPV/PVAF golf outing.

Candidates will compete for acceptance in EPAP through a nomination and application process. Candidates may be nominated by an AIAPV member or may self-nominate by completing the requisite form. Nominees will be contacted by AIAPV staff to confirm their eligibility and will then be invited to complete their application by responding to questions about leadership in the field of architecture and their goals from the program. Applicants may respond via a written, video, or digital submission.

A jury led by AIAPV Fellows will evaluate applicants based on their exhibition of thought leadership potential. As already noted, the Fellows will provide a curated mentorship experience for EPAP winners and will support the program in many other ways.

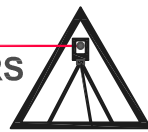
